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# General information on local meets

### Courses

The club uses the USOF "color" designations wherever applicable. A description of the courses is as follows:

Color	White	Yellow	Orange	Brown	Green	Red	Blue
Approx. distance	2-4 km	3-5 km	4-7 km	3-5 km	4-7 km	6-10 km	8-14 km

The <u>White</u> course is intended to be easy enough for first-time participants after a short introduction to the sport. Control points are generally on trails or similarly easy-to-locate features.

The <u>Yellow</u> course is slightly more difficult than the White course. Control points are generally placed close to but not right at easy-to-find features, such as on a knoll that is 50 m away from a trail junction.

The <u>Orange</u> course requires more map-reading and course-planning skills than the Yellow course. Controls will generally have a good attack point, but the attack point may be more subtle than on the Yellow course, or the control will be placed further from the attack point. The route choice from one control to the attack point for the next control is often less obvious than on the Yellow course.

The <u>Brown</u>, <u>Green</u>, <u>Red</u>, and <u>Blue</u> courses differ from each other only in length. At local parks, they are usually the most difficult course that can be set given the size and the terrain of the park. Map-reading, compass, and route-planning skills will be tested to a greater degree on this course.

Sometimes other courses may be offered, such as a <u>Motala</u> (a course which involves one or more map exchanges), or a <u>Line-O</u> or <u>Score-O</u>. These courses will be explained in the meet instructions at any meet that uses these formats.

## Entry fees

The entry fees to ROC meets are \$3.00 per individual or group for ROC members and \$6.00 for non-members. If several people (a family group for example) enter as a group using the same map, the fee is still \$3.00 (members) or \$6.00 (non-members). Additional maps are available for \$1.00 each. A person or group can do a second course using the same map for no additional charge (if you complete the White course and decide to try the Yellow course, for example).

## **Beginner instruction**

Beginners are always welcome; there is an informal beginners' clinic approximately 15 minutes after the beginning of the event, and all meets offer a course suitable for beginning orienteers.

# Score-O and Sprint at Webster Park, July 23, 2008

The weather was full of surprises on this Wednesday afternoon. About an hour before the start time the meet team was sitting in the shelter watching a severe thunderstorm rolling through the area and guessing if anyone will dare to show up or whether the meet should be canceled.

Twenty minutes later the storm was gone, the weather manager produced another quite and pleasant evening and, even though the woods were wet and the trails were muddy, a record breaking crowd (at least by the S ummer night meet standards) came to Webster Park to enjoy the event - we had 35 Score-O starters and 22 sprinters. Majority of the attendants were able to enjoy two cutting edge courses paying just one nominal registration fee that the ROC manages to keep unchanged despite the nation wide mortgage crisis, increasing oil prices and upcoming presidential elections.

Rob Holmes blasted through both courses concurring all but one of the Score-O controls with one minute to spare and winning the Sprint by a substantial margin. Stina Bridgeman was the best female runner of the night, winning in a close battle with a young superstar Silvia Klassen. A few brave souls led by Carol Moran and Luke Lyons successfully completed the White course despite the course setter's advice that after the excessive rain the Score-O would provide a much friendlier user experience.

Some participants complained about the complexity of the Sprint course which was, in their opinion, excessive for this category. The meet organizers firmly disagree with this claim, simply because a one mile course in Webster Park cannot possibly be hard and that the longer than usual completion time can be explained by exhaustion of the runners after the Score-O and the natural beauty of the park which prompted some of the competitors to opt for extra relaxation time instead of focusing on reaching the finish line as quickly as possible.

Post event activities were handled in a well organized matter. The last control (the one that failed to cooperate with the flag pickup officer Worner on the dark Wednesday night) was successfully retrieved from the woods on Saturday and all the flags have been dried and prepped for the next meet.
