2011 Canal Cities Orienteering Festival July 29 - August 7 by Steve Tylock, meet director

Calling All Orienteers!

This summer, ROC is partnering with neighboring clubs to hold a 9-day orienteering festival, and if you haven't blocked off the week yet, you should!

The festivities start on the weekend of July 30 and 31 with the US Classic Championships held a bit North of Syracuse. Competitors add the results for races both days to determine the champion.

Then during the week of August 1-5, ROC will host the OUSA convention including morning sessions at the Harley School, afternoon training at nearby parks, and competitive events at night, on mountain bikes, and in canoes. The festival also includes a variety of social activities to bring the community together.

Before leaving town, we'll also host the US Trail-O Championships on Friday August 5th. This discipline of orienteering requires careful analysis of maps and terrain to precisely identify features while allowing for competitors with limited mobility. The convention will include an educational session on it, and it will also be available as a recreational event.

And finally, on the weekend of August 6-7, the Buffalo club will be hosting Sprint, Middle, and Long distance events in the parks south of the city.

If you have never been to an "A meet", you'll want to attend to see the best that orienteering has to offer. Terrain, courses, and logistics are top notch, and you'll compete along side the best in the nation. If you have been to A meets, you'll want to attend these - that offer a great deal right here in our neighborhood.

All information and registration is on-line at 2011CCOF.org, and look for "The Whole Darn Thing!" discount to make the experience affordable. Deadlines apply to Early, Regular, and Late registration, so don't delay.

Season-Opening Icebreaker (including Club Series #1) Saturday April 16 at Webster Park

The opening meet of the 2011 spring-summer-fall orienteering season will feature a new starting location within Webster Park, and also a newly-mapped area west of the park which will provide the opportunity for people on the Green and Red courses to experience some new terrain and "enjoy" some longer-than-normal courses.

The meet will be Saturday, April 16, at Holt Lodge (starting between noon and 2 p.m.). Holt Lodge is on the east side of Holt Road, just south of Lake Road (this is essentially right across Holt Road from Parkview Lodge, the more typical starting venue at Webster Park). This will allow people on the White and Yellow courses to experience the terrain on the east side of Holt Road, which was added to our map a year ago.

The area that has been added this year is the Whiting Road nature trail area, on the west side of Whiting Road. The Green and Red courses will venture into this area.

Courses are being fine-tuned as of this writing, but approximate course lengths are: White 1.3 km; Yellow 2.1 km; Orange 4.3 km; Brown 3.9 km; Green 6.6 km; and Red 8.3 km.

General information on local meets

Courses

The club uses the USOF "color" designations wherever applicable. A description of the courses is as follows:

Color	White	Yellow	Orange	Brown	Green	Red	Blue
Approx. distance	2-4 km	3-5 km	4-7 km	3-5 km	4-7 km	6-10 km	8-14 km

The White course is intended to be easy enough for first-time participants after a short introduction to the sport. Control points are generally on trails or similarly easy-to-locate features.

The <u>Yellow</u> course is slightly more difficult than the White course. Control points are generally placed close to but not right at easy-tofind features, such as on a knoll that is 50 m away from a trail junction.

The <u>Orange</u> course requires more map-reading and course-planning skills than the Yellow course. Controls will generally have a good attack point, but the attack point may be more subtle than on the Yellow course, or the control will be placed further from the attack point. The route choice from one control to the attack point for the next control is often less obvious than on the Yellow course.

The Brown, Green, Red, and Blue courses differ from each other only in length. At local parks, they are usually the most difficult course that can be set given the size and the terrain of the park. Map-reading, compass, and route-planning skills will be tested to a greater degree on this course.

Sometimes other courses may be offered, such as a Motala (a course which involves one or more map exchanges), or a Line-O or Score-O. These courses will be explained in the meet instructions at any meet that uses these formats.

Entry fees

The entry fees to ROC meets are \$3.00 per individual or group for ROC members and \$6.00 for non-members. If several people (a family group for example) enter as a group using the same map, the fee is still \$3.00 (members) or \$6.00 (non-members). Additional maps are available for \$1.00 each. A person or group can do a second course using the same map for no additional charge (if you complete the White course and decide to try the Yellow course, for example).

Beginner instruction

Beginners are always welcome; there is an informal beginners' clinic approximately 15 minutes after the beginning of the event, and all meets offer a course suitable for beginning orienteers.

Mendon Ponds Ski-O February 6, 2011

Our second Ski-O of the year in Mendon Ponds Park started at Cavalry Lodge. The courses set by Jim Russell had very little overlap with the previous meet. The night before the meet, a heavy layer of wet snow fell, making travel difficult off the beaten track. Jim's advanced courses offered opportunities to shorten the distance by bushwhacking, but that could be very slow (unless an earlier skier made a trail for you.)

We tried a new preregistration procedure, masterminded by Tyler Borden, which allowed members to enter their information online. This seemed to work quite well. We also used e-punching. In addition to the usual advantages (a record of the time for each leg,) it eliminated the need for the start/finish crew to wait outside or signal through the window.
